**ICT Standards: MSP points the way forward in Europe, 21<sup>st</sup> May 2014**

- ETSI produces standards and specifications with a global application that also meet EU policy issues and will continue to do so.
- ETSI's membership mix (770 members from 63 countries)
  - World's leading ICT companies, operators and service providers
  - SME's / Micro Enterprises (25%), Research Organizations and Universities (12%)
  - European Administrations (34), NSOs (39), Associations and Users
- Globalization by partnering and cooperation (currently ~100 partnerships with various organizations worldwide) , both for technical standards and for policy

-  ETSI is continuing work to support areas under the ICT RP:
  - Electronic signatures – 36 ENs, 25 TS & 6 TRs under development. Remote interoperability events (ASic event held and others under preparation)
  - Intelligent Transport – Release 1 complete plus further 8 ENs and 15 TS under development
  - Accessibility – EN 301 549 plus 2 TRs adopted and published in 2014
  - eCall – Test specifications and TR 103 140 (eCall for VoIP) published
  - Emergency communications – ES 203 178 giving EU requirements for emergency caller location determination and transport. ES on protocol specifications under development
  - Interoperability events 3 held to date plus 4 to be held – Mezzanine film format, Small Cell LTE, M2M and SIPit

-  ETSI strongly supports the fundamental elements of the European Standardization System
  - Standardization is market driven
  - Develop standards primarily based on consensus rather than voting
  - Make those standards available for use in Europe best fulfilling the needs of Europe
  - Use and improve the current mechanisms offered by the ESO's (PAS)
  - Continue and promote involvement of all relevant SSOs
  - Promote the use of standards to address legislation, regulation and policies
  - Give the necessary financial support in a reliable way
-  Continue the MSP, support the usage of the first results and constantly improve it
